### LA GRANDE OPERA ITALIANA--PATRIMONIO DELL' UMANITA'



In December 2023, only about eight months ago but it seems like years ago at the rate we are going, UNESCO placed Italian Opera on its world cultural list that designates Italian Opera as an art form that is a "Patrimony of Humanity." These special awards are usually reserved for locations and special historic sites, like Matera Sasso in Italy. So it is quite an honor to acknowledge Italian Opera with this world class achievement, and now considered a "patrimony of humanity."

IAHF member and Professor emeritus, Bill McCraw, went on to note that to commemorate this recognition a grand concert featuring leading Italian and international singers was given at the Arena di Verona on June 7. Riccardo Muti conducted the

first part of the concert with special artist and conductors taking part in the festivities. The complete event is on YouTube, "La Grande Opera Italiana, Patrimonio dell'Umanita'" Also as an FYI the seating capacity of the Roman Arena—it's 22,000. ### A CELEBRATION OF ITALIAN WINE WITH SHELLEY LINDGREN



In celebration of her visit to the IAHF there was a regional buffet and sampling of both Italian wines and varietals from Shelley's wineries. She is producing wines in 3 California locations, Hollister, Sonoma and Napa, under the Tansy Label. She shared with us two varietals: Fiana, and Fallaghina; additional wines included Borgo Torre-Le Marche, Rifonzoli-Rosso di Toscana, Massaro Del Fondo-Puglia, and Pinot Grigo -Venezia.

To try to summarize the content of the talk one would have to replicate the event. Suffice to say it was "wine talk" from begging to end and reflective of both a renaissance lady and an engaged audience. When these sorts of conversations "connect" they really become more than the sum total of their parts. It was very much a fascinating

their parts. It was very much a fascinating learning experience about the grape growing regions of Italy. Prior to visiting us, Shelley was a judge at a tasting of Sicilian wines in NYC.

Shelley also shared with us her vision of her restaurant, A16, on Chestnut Street in San Francisco. There are now plans to expand the operation with a similar restaurant in the area along with a wine tasting facility featuring her California wines, in Napa. We will keep our readers apprised of the opening of both new ventures.

I had always wondered about the name, A16, and in the Q/A someone asked about it and Shelley noted her restaurant was named after Autostrada 16, which traverses some of the major wine growing regions in Italy....which makes sense given her passion for Italian wines and all the years it took to research and write the book. A16 was a well-traveled route.



Shelley was knighted by the Italian Government for her work and promotion of Italian wines. A cornerstone of the book is moving beyond the Tuscan/Veneto/Piemonte triangle of Italian wines and opening to the spectrum to include all regions of Italian wine productions. Shelley and Kate's book begins to close a knowledge gap with a systematic survey of many of the regional varietal in Italy today. The book itself will be reviewed in a later article by our book critic Linda Binkley. One exciting piece of networking resulting from this event is planning two special wine related activities as follows:

PLEASE NOTE: The first event will be to work on a field trip to A16 in San Francisco, with a fixed prize menu, details to follow. In addition, many of you will recall two years ago when we sampled a special selection of regional wines from Guglielmo Winery. We have a tentative date Sunday November 3rd, which is the last Sunday of Daylight savings time, being planned, and will include a catered dinner and tastings from small planting of grapes from their family's origins. These wines are of limited production, can only be purchased at the winery.

#### INTERESTED IN VISITING A16?

Following Shelley's presentation, one thing led to another for a small but interested group of Italian wine enthusiasts. We are considering having dinner at her award-winning restaurant A16 in San Francisco. Because it is a popular venue, with limited street parking, we are considering going on Monday, October 7th for dinner and wine pairing.

The restaurant A16 is located on Chestnut Street in San Francisco, near the Presidio. It is named after the Autostrada, A16, that traverses many important wine regions in Italy. It was a major route on Shelley's travels through Italy doing research on her landmark book <u>Italian Wines</u>. Likewise, A16 has become a culinary landmark destination and Michelin recommended restaurant.

If you're interested in visiting A16 on that date, please call the IAHF (408 202-5773) by September 20th to let me know of your interest. I will get back to you regarding details as we plan this visit. This event is a "work in progress." Depending on interest we will work out the details for the event, including car pooling.

### Spotlight on Stanley Olivar, IAHF's Office Manager

President Dave Perzinski accepted his application, and after a few days, Stanley began work at the IAHF office. The Board of Directors members were quickly impressed with Stanley's skills, and his very apparent fondness for Italian culture. Stanley caught on quickly to how IAHF social events are handled and did especially well managing our busy rental program. In fact, in time, he contributed to improvements in several areas.

### Festa d'autunno alla Cantina Guglielmo!



we are going back to Guglielmo Winery for a special Sunday dinner! Save Sunday, No-

vember 3, for a South County adventure. IAHF members and friends will visit the historic Guglielmo Winery founded in 1925 by Emilio Guglielmo for a catered dinner and wine tasting starting at 5pm.

Dinner will be catered by "Fire 4 Hire." We will also enjoy some wine tasting of a special selection of limited release varietal wines grown from ancestral grapevine stock from the Piemonte region, the family's origin. This is a timely reminder too of this wonderful wine growing region right in our own back yard as well as our rich agricultural roots. We have planned this event on the cusp of daylight savings time so you can drive to the area in daylight. Come a little early and visit the tasting room and grounds at this landmark destination. The winery itself is a fascinating part of Bay Area history.

By popular request The menu will include antipasti, grilled romaine wedges with gorgonzola cheese and herb dressing. There will be a choice of entrees: stuffed bone in veal chop or herb crusted halibut, both with a side dish of red skinned garlic mashed potatoes and grilled asparagus with "focaccia al rosemarino." Dessert will be tiramisu.

> We will be using the indoor reception room that accommodates approximately 80 people. We will try to have assigned seating of up to 8 people per table. The sooner we know the people in your party, the easier it will be to do the seating.

> The Guglielmo Family Winery is located at 1480 East Main Avenue in Morgan Hill. The cost of the event is \$80 per person. To make your reservation online, mail a check or pay in advance at the IAHF. Payment must be made by October 29, likewise no refunds can be given after that date.

This is an exciting time to be a Board member. We currently have an enthusiastic and varied Board that broadly represents the diversity of our Italian American Community. The role of our governing Board is to provide oversight for the operations of the IAHF, make the necessary decisions that impact membership and activities in accordance with IAHF Bylaws, and provide the leadership to implement our common vision! It is also a great opportunity to work with a creative team to plan and promote our Italian Heritage and assist the IAHF to carry out its vision and mission statement of sharing our culture and values with the community. We welcome new ideas about things to offer the Italian American community or thoughts about ways to improve what we are already doing.

Board members are expected to attend monthly Board meetings, participate in events, chair committees, volunteer as needed and be dedicated to promoting and preserving our Italian heritage and culture. The time commitment is ~15 hours a month outside of the monthly meetings. 
### Honoring a Hero: Joe Gallegos

### Grand Marshal in D.C.'s Memorial Day Parade



Here is another heartwarming story about an IAHF centenarian, Joe Gallegos, "Grandpa" to his family. Joe was invited to be the Grand Marshal on the veteran's float for the National Memorial Day Parade in Washington, D.C. on May 27, 2024.

The American Veterans Center sponsored the trip. Joe was on the float with all veterans of the Mighty Eighth Air Force, plus the current Miss America, Madison Marsh, who is an active-duty Air Force Pilot.







Throughout the week, he was honored in many ways. Among them, was his video interview by the American Veterans Center that will be published and preserved in the National Archives. His story will be part of American history. Joe shared stories about his experience working as a radio operator and making many trips across Western Europe transporting gasoline for General Patton.

Joe reflected on his gratitude and how proud he was of the honor he received to serve as Grand Marshal. However, he wanted to share the message of the importance of remembering and honoring veterans. Joe had a message to pass along to the future generation: "Carry on the best we can and trust God along the way."

At 100 years old, Joe continues to defy expectations by embracing new challenges and adventures. Several years ago, he began taking online Italian classes after many years of taking Italian classes with Delia. Joe eagerly attends the weekly online Italian classes. He is always prepared, and his enthusiasm is infectious. His classmates are inspired by his dedication and sharp mind, as am I, his teacher.

columns, who has participated in several reunions. She was excited to share that she and other local Rosies were honored at the Spirit of '45 weekend on August 10th, held in Kelly Park.




### **Our Own Rosie**

From 1942 to 1945 Vita worked as a Rosie in Binghamton, New York. Her brother had joined the Navy, and Vita wanted to follow his example. But she did not meet the minimum height standard (who knew there was such a thing?).

A referral to the Navy depot led to a job sewing work outfits and uniforms.

It didn't pay a lot, but she gained satisfaction from knowing her work was crucial.



The large room housed 20-25 women, diligently working the foot pedals of the sewing machines as they pushed the cloth under the needles. Efficiency called for piecework; Vita worked with assembling the pants.

"Every morning at 7 o'clock, I would go to the depot, sit at my sewing machine, sew the uniforms, and then at 4 o'clock, I'd go home . . . I did that every day for those three years."



But Vita wanted to do more. At night she worked for the American Red Cross. She would greet

trainloads of soldiers while handing out coffee, donuts, cigarettes, sandwiches, pens, and paper. Although she enjoyed meeting the soldiers, it also felt bittersweet, wondering who among them might not make it home.





### Colorado's Carlino Brothers, a Bootlegging Empire

Author Sam Carlino has delved into his family history with intense, scholastic detail. His work has become a major contribution to the history of

the Mafia in the United States, specifically the lesserresearched Colorado area. The book is an eyeopener for those of us who thought Colorado was just cowboys and Coors Beer.

Colorado's Carlino Brothers, A Bootlegging Empire reveals a sordid story of murder and intrigue between the related Carlino and Danna families who sadly brought the Sicilian vendetta way of life to American soil. The number of murders the brothers were involved in is astounding. The connection of the Carlino brothers to the New York and Chicago Mafia leaders is researched and detailed and old

photographs of the Prohibition era enhance the narrative.

Author Carlino's San Jose family is well-respected, law-abiding, hard-working and successful. Sam always believed his grandfather had died of pneumonia. Finding the truth of his death by a Mafia gunman led Sam to become the family historian, albeit a sad history. Author Carlino shows exceptional writing skills, deftly sorting out the intricate and convoluted connections driving the illegal movement of Prohibition alcohol throughout Colorado and driving the on-going vendettas. It's sad to see family and friends turn on each other with murderous intent over control of the illegal business. The family made poor choices after immigrating from Sicily and most paid the ultimate price. Sam's grandmother proved to be boldly brave and escaped with her sons and created a new and beautiful life in San Jose, the true American dream.

Author Carlino's writing is swift and clear. It was a nice touch to see the chapter titles written in Italian, though I wondered that perhaps they should have been in Sicilian. Historians will appreciate Author Carlino's contribution to the history of the Sicilian Mafia as it existed in Colorado during and before Prohibition, a bloody time for those involved and a fearful time for the families.


